

Wee Tiny Black Cat Sock

Materials:

- Fingering weight yarn in orange and black
- Size 1US double point needles

Abbreviations:

MC – Orange k – knit sts – stitches
CC – Black kfb – knit front and back w&t: wrap and turn

Toe:

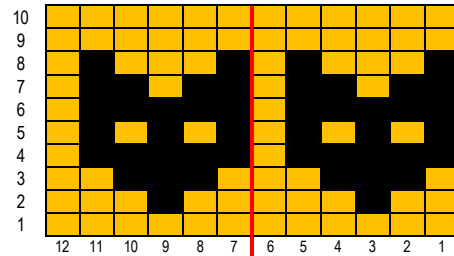
- Rnd 1:** Using MC and [Judy's Magic Cast-On](#), cast on 12 sts.
Rnd 2: (kfb, k3, kfb, k1) twice (16 sts)
Rnd 3: Knit
Rnd 4: (kfb, k5, kfb, k1) twice (20 sts)
Rnd 5: Knit
Rnd 6: (kfb, k7, kfb, k1) twice (24 sts)



Foot: Follow Chart 1 or use written directions; knit all sts:

- Rnd 1:** Knit across MC
Rnd 2: [2MC, 1CC, 3MC]x4
Rnd 3: [1MC, 3CC, 2MC]x4
Rnd 4: [5CC, 1MC]x4
Rnd 5: [1CC, 1MC, 1CC, 1MC, 1CC, 1MC]x4
Rnd 6: [k5CC, k1MC]x4
Rnd 7: [2CC, 1MC, 2CC, 1MC]x4
Rnd 8: [1CC, 3MC, 1CC, 1MC]x4
Rnd 9: Knit across MC
Rnd 10: Knit across MC

Chart 1



Follow chart from bottom to top and from right to left

Short row heel:

Using MC only:

- Row 1:** Knit 11, w&t
Row 2: Purl 10, w&t
Row 3: Knit 9, w&t
Row 4: Purl 8, w&t
Row 5: Knit 7, w&t
Row 6: Purl 6, w&t
Row 7: Knit 5, w&t
Row 8: Purl 4, w&t

Work the wraps:

- Row 1:** Knit 4, knit 1 w/wrap, w&t (this stitch has 2 wraps)
Row 2: Purl 5, purl 1 w/wrap, w&t
Row 3: Knit 6, knit 1 w/wrap (picking up both wraps on this and all subsequent stitches), w&t
Row 4: Purl 7, purl 1 w/wrap, w&t
Row 5: Knit 8, knit 1 w/wrap, w&t
Row 6: Purl 9, purl 1 w/wrap, w&t
Row 7: Knit 10, knit 1 w/wrap (do not w&t), k6 (mark this stitch as the end of the row/round)

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You will now begin working in the round again at the end of Row 7. *There will be one double-wrapped purl stitch remaining on the end of the heel. Work these wraps together with the stitch during the first round of the leg.*

Leg:

Follow Chart 2 or use written directions; knit all sts:

Rnd 1: Knit across MC

Rnd 2: Knit across MC

Rnd 3: Knit across MC

Rnd 4: 4MC, 2CC, 3MC, 2CC, [2MC, 1CC]x4, 1MC

Rnd 5: 3MC, 2CC, 3MC, 2CC, [2MC, 1CC]x4, 1MC

Rnd 6: 3MC, 2CC, 3MC, 2CC, 4MC, [2CC, 1MC]x3, 1MC

Rnd 7: 2MC, 2CC, 3MC, 2CC, 5MC, [2CC, 1MC]x3, 1MC

Rnd 8: 2MC, 7CC, 1MC, 1CC, [2MC, 1CC]x4, 1MC

Rnd 9: 1MC, 8CC, 1MC, 2CC, [1MC, 2CC]x3, 2MC

Rnd 10: 1MC, 11CC, 1MC, [1CC, 2MC]x3, 1CC, 1MC

Rnd 11: 1MC, 10CC, [1MC, 2CC]x3, 2MC

Rnd 12: 1MC, 8CC, 4MC, [1CC, 2MC]x3, 1CC, 1MC

Rnd 13: 6CC, 1MC, 3CC, 4MC, [2CC, 1MC]x3, 1MC

Rnd 14: 1CC, 1MC, 3CC, 1MC, 5CC, [2MC, 1CC]x4, 1MC

Rnd 15: [1CC, 2MC]x2, [1CC, 1MC]x3, 2MC, [2CC, 1MC]x3, 1MC

Rnd 16: 1CC, 5MC, 5CC, [2MC, 1CC]x4, 1MC

Rnd 17: 1CC, 5MC, 2CC, 1MC, 2CC, 3MC, [2CC, 1MC]x3, 1MC

Rnd 18: 2CC, 4MC, 1CC, 3MC, 1CC, [2MC, 1CC]x4, 1MC

Rnd 19: Knit across MC

Rnd 20: Knit across MC

Rnd 21: Knit across MC

Sewn bind off

Break off a length of yarn around 3 times as long as the knitting and thread it onto a yarn needle.

- * Insert the threaded yarn needle into the first 2 stitches on the knitting needle as if to purl and draw the yarn through. Reinsert the yarn needle into the first stitch on the knitting needle as if to knit, draw the yarn through and slip the stitch off the knitting needle.*

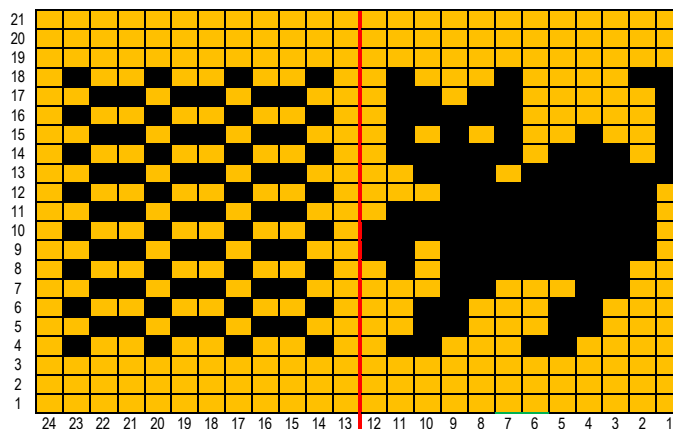
Repeat from * to *.

Weave in all ends.

Chart 2



Follow chart from bottom to top and from right to left

If you prefer, you could repeat stitches 1-12 instead of stitches 13-24 for a cat on the back side of the sock
